"Those selected attended 3 pre-trip meetings at the council where the trip was discussed which included the expected behaviours while away, what we were going to do as a group and also how we were going to work with the Flinders Island Council to offer some school holiday programs to the youth of the Island," he said.

Monday is members' day, so please drop in to check us out. The Shed is in Maxwell Street.


