COMMUNITY DONATIONS RESULT IN BRAND NEW PLAYGROUND

You may have noticed that some new, weird and wonderful shapes have appeared on the edge of the Village Green? Or heard shrieks of laughter and children's playful chatter from down by the foreshore? Dorset Council have been busy constructing a brand new community playground, which has brought with it a buzz of excitement and a youthful injection of life to the village green area and just in time for the Easter break!

With considerable enthusiasm having been generated in the local community as people watched the new play equipment taking shape, the Lions Club of Bridport took the opportunity to formally present Dorset Council with their contribution towards the project at a public ceremony on the Bridport foreshore on Thursday 6th April 2017.

Community Projects Coordinator for the Dorset Council, Anneka Ferguson said new playgrounds are expensive, and significant funds were required before the project could proceed.

"The Lions Club of Bridport gave the project an impressive kick-start by committing \$20,000 in March 2016, and offering their support to source other funding.

"This is an enormous donation to be made towards a community project by a local not-for-profit group, and the Lions Club of Bridport is to be commended for their vision and support towards this project," Ms Ferguson said.

ANZAC DAY - BRIDPORT REMEMBERS

Despite the inclement weather a good crowd of about 150 stalwarts turned up for the Dawn Service. Thanks to our sound technician, Ashley Barnett, for having the foresight to get three gazebos from the Bridport Primary School, the night before. It certainly gave shelter to those without umbrellas. Chaplain Judy Jackson conducted the prayers, and President, Simon Hirst, gave an address on the Dickin Medal, the serving animals' equivalent of the Victoria Cross. Surprisingly, pigeons have won this award for bravery more than any other animal. Approximately 130 people then gathered after at the Bunker Club for the hearty annual breakfast.

Flag Marshall, Bob Child, led the Parade from the CWA to the Hall, where around 200 people gathered for the 11 o'clock service. Sherrin Jackman was the Chaplain at this service. The President gave a speech on the history of the 40th Battalion, an all-Tasmanian regiment which was formed in 1916. Two of its members won VCs.

Sing Australia, led the hymn singing with Margaret Viney on piano, and children from the Primary School and the guides provided a song and poem relevant to the day. The Commemorative Address was given by Scottsdale High student, Marley Seckold-Bamfield. In his well prepared and researched speech, he spoke on the exploits of a serving member during the Battle of the Somme. It was a very moving speech and gained the applause it deserved.

At the conclusion of the service, the majority of the congregation moved to the cenotaph in much kinder weather for the wreath laying.

BRAND NEW PLAYGROUND FOR BRIDPORT

The idea for a new adventure playground in Bridport was originally raised by the local Lions Club of Bridport in November 2015.

Ms Ferguson said local youth surveys conducted as part of community consultation for Dorset Council's Youth Strategic Plan 2016-2019 also identified recreation as a top priority area, and that playgrounds should be made more age-appropriate in order to support the health and wellbeing of older children in our community.

"Recreational activities are particularly important, and Dorset Council recognised that investment in such infrastructure had the opportunity to promote more active and social lifestyles amongst the local community," she said.

A total of \$100,000 was subsequently committed in Dorset Council's 2016/17 Budget towards the project. Dorset Council was awarded a further \$50,000 through the Tasmanian Community Fund in August 2016.

"The combined funds have allowed for the purchase and installation of more than five new pieces of play equipment in Bridport, the majority providing exciting new play experiences for older children," she said.

The new Bridport Community Playground will be officially opened at an Opening Ceremony planned for a later date to be confirmed.

"In the meantime, you and your children are welcome to test out the new equipment, as many have already done.

"Dorset Council has been pleased to be able to commit to a key infrastructure project that not only provides great community benefits, but that has such broad support throughout the local community," Ms Ferguson said.

One of the first jobs to happen within will be the cutting and welding of steel seat frames for the Bridport Netball Club.

Weather nuts and volunteer BOM **BOM** weather readers - take note. You may have noticed the daily **REPORT** readings in the Examiner for Bridport have dropped off the towns reported recently. BOM tells us that is a national decision made by the parent newspaper company. However, they tell us the readings are available online at www.bom.gov.au/tas/ obserations/tasall.shml which means the work undertaken by Bridport Innovations volunteers twice a day 7 days a week is still valued. We are endeavouring to have this decision reviewed.

The North East Field Naturalist Club

The North East Tasmanian Field Naturalists Club Inc. offer a program of outings for members.

The May outing is on Saturday 13th May at Ralph's Falls.

After the rain, it's very likely there will be fungi, like this Mycena (pictured) popping up along the Bridport Walking Track. They continue to be seen well into the winter months. Much work is being done on identifying fungi in Tasmania, although many species are yet to be discovered and named. A useful reference for identifying them has been on bookshelves (and in backpacks) for a year or so now – it's the FungiFlip. In the format of the EucaFlip and the TreeFlip it contains 360 large thumbnail photographs and folds up like a map.

Field Nats .who have one will carry a copy on their next outing. The outing to Ralph's Falls will be held on Saturday 13th May. This outing was originally planned in 2016 but was cancelled when the road was damaged by heavy rain. The walk to the falls and on the Cash's Gorge circuit, is classified as easy. It will be at a relaxed pace as we look for autumn orchids and fungi. Meet 10am in the Main Street of Ringarooma.

DORSET BIKE USERS GROUP (DBUG)

The Scottsdale ride on the 2nd April, organised by Terry Moon, was enjoyed in perfect weather by six riders. The initial hill on the shortcut from North East Park to the Rail Trail was challenging for most and Terry suggests that it may be better to start at the Art Gallery Café end of the rail trail if we were to do this ride again.

The next ride will be on Sunday 7th May. There are potentially three stages to the ride depending on how far you may wish to ride. The initial stage is from Bridport to the Art Gallery Café in Scottsdale, a distance of about 20 km. If you wish to ride this stage please meet Phil Hall at the car park opposite the Bunker Café at 9:15 am for a 9:30 am start.

If you would like a shorter distance please meet me at the Scottsdale Art Gallery Café at 10:30 for a 10:45 start. Phil's group will meet us there for the second stage which will include sections on the Tasman Highway, Pennells Road and East Minstone Road covering a total distance of 13.5 km. (3.4 km of Pennells Road is gravel but with a relatively smooth surface).

As our usual target for a DBug ride is 20 km we could do an additional third stage, another 7.4 km loop from the Café via William Street and Lilydale Road, Bridport Road and King Street back to the Café for lunch. Once we finish the second stage we will see how many would like to do this third loop as it does have two short but relatively steep sections. Lunch will be at the Scottsdale Art Gallery Café.
