COUNCIL STEPS UP FOR TRACK

Reports on track conditions, even compliments, for the Bridport River Forest Walk can be passed on direct to the Dorset Council after it assumed responsibility for the track.

The hand over to the council was part of the memorandum of understanding covering the track five years after it was completed.

Any information about track conditions can be reported directly to Dorset Council via its on line customer request service or through reception.

The one million dollar project was built as part of a Federal and State government job training program and overseen by community group Bridport Innovations.

Group president Jill Van den Bosch said it had proven a fantastic asset for the town.

"More than 50 traineeships and jobs were created during the project which resulted in almost five kilometres of new track."

Dorset Mayor Greg Howard who accepted the track hand over said the infrastructure had more than met the design brief.

"It's certainly exceeded expectations so far as being an attraction for the town and a health and fitness benefit for local residents.

"I know there are a lot of people who drive to Bridport just to walk on the track," Cr Howard said.

"You can rest assured the council will be making sure it stays in the sort of condition expected."

Ms Van den Bosch said while prime responsibility was passing to the council Bridport Innovations would retain a strong interest in the track and part of the original concept detailed how it might apply for grants to improve sections from time to time and work with the council to put the improvements into place.


"We expect to have a fitness guru to lead some warm up exercises and runners will also be able to get a massage at the end of their exertions."

The netball kicked off as soon as the second plane load of netballers landed from Bridport. North East V Flinders in the first match was close in the first quarter, which was goal for goal with Flinders Island's Toni Wood barely missing a shot. NE broke free due to dynamite defence from Casey Richardson and Emily Lovegrove, to win the game 13-22. The Robbins had a physical game against Flinders with both centre court players working hard to deliver to their goalies. The Robbins came out on top with a nine goal lead. North East took on the Robbins in the last rostered game, with NE player Jo Freeland being a good match up on the Robbin's Chelsea Coleman in the goal circle. Keeley Lester's defence was outstanding, allowing the NE to make the most of turned over balls. NE won by 6. Flinders then took on Robbins in the preliminary final, with Megsy Boyes and Dolly Wheatley trying her hardest through the centre for Flinders, but went down by 11. The grand final was played after a short break, as the Robbins had played three in a row. North East went out hard and were not let down by magnificent accuracy from D'Arne Mason. Robbins player Kresta Davis stepped up her defence and was picking passes off through the centre court and across the circle. Some handy half-time oranges kicked in and picked up the pace for NE to be up by three at three-quarter time. NE won the grand final by eight.

On Sunday, 11th September, despite the occasional light shower of rain and a couple of testing climbs, 13 riders enjoyed the 26km Glen Road loop. In fact some riders did not seem to be greatly excited about the testing climbs but I think that I was forgiven when the Pipers Brook Winery provided us with an excellent lunch. Thanks to Pipers Brook for fitting us in to an already crowded restaurant.

Given that we have had a couple of longer and more testing rides in the past two months it is now time to enjoy an easier run down to Christmas. The program for the next three months is as follows:

October 2nd

An old favourite commencing at the car park at the Cove Restaurant in Georgetown at 10:30 for a 10:45am start. The ride follows the cycle path alongside the river to the Lighthouse at Low Head, then return. A round trip of 18km, with no hills, which is suitable for all riders of both Road and Mountain Bikes.

November 6th

Commencing in Bridport at the Bridport Hall at 10:30 for a 10:45am start, a 20km loop south along the Bridport - Scottsdale Road to Boddingtons Road, then follows Boddingtons Road to the Waterhouse Road, then back to Bridport. The Boddingtons Road section is gravel and is definitely Mountain Bikes only.

December 4th

The ride on December 4th will be from Weymouth to Lulworth and return, the same ride as December 2015. It is a very pleasant trip of 17km with only a couple of gentle climbs in and out of the two villages. The road is all bitumen and is suitable for road bikes. Please meet at the boat ramp in Weymouth at 10:30 for a 10:45am Start. Simply follow the main road all the way through Weymouth and when you see the river, park on the grass overlooking the boat ramp. Those seeking more of a workout could ride from Bridport?

Parks & Wildlife Service News - October 2016

Plenty of raining following very dry conditions resulted in roads, campsites and drains inundated with water. The damage continues to be assessed and in many instance across the NE, PWS have commenced repair works including:

Waterhouse Conservation Area along with Petal Point camping area's will have road and drainage works including resheeting, grading and hardening in camp sites. Works are scheduled to be completed by the end of October, subject to weather conditions. Blackmans Lagoon is inundated with water, with road access to the camp area and beach access currently under water.

For those in Bridport, Granite Point road has had some re sheeting and drain repairs completed. This should assist with the ongoing seepage from roads above and potential future heavy rain events.

Access to Adams Beach continues to be a concern with the ever changing natural foreshore/ocean interface. PWS are investigating access options to see what may be a longer term solution to maintaining access in this location. PWS asks visitors and residents to comply with any signage or direction provided in relation to access to this location and appreciates your patience while solutions are investigated. Trent River is the alternative dog exercising area.

Mt Victoria and Ralph Falls - despite significant road works completed during 2015, this road was again subject to the effects of heavy rainfall. Road works are scheduled during October subject to weather conditions to repair the damaged sections. PWS asks that visitors and residents comply with signage and recommended 4wd access only until such time as works have been completed. During works the road may be closed to all traffic. Signage and information will be circulated once dates are confirmed.
