October is Great Cycle Challenge month and 8 year old, Connor Burns, of Bridport has signed up for the challenge.

Connor, a grade 3 student at Bridport Primary School, is passionate about mountain biking and spends every minute he can on his bike around Bridport or up at Derby on the trails.

Connor has been bike riding since he could walk, but has taken a specific interest in mountain biking over the past 2 years.

"I love to ride because of the thrill, especially out in the bush, every ride is different from the last time," Connor said.

"I love all the trail network up at Derby, especially Krushka's and Return To Sender and I'm eager to ride Trouty but Mum won't let me,' he said.

This October he is spending the month riding his bike to raise much needed money for kids with cancer.

"I wanted to do the Great Cycle Challenge when I saw it pop up on Mum's Facebook and became interested.

"Once Mum and Dad had explained the challenge was about riding to raise money for kids who are sick with cancer, I knew straight away this was something I wanted to be involved in and I signed up," Connor said.

larapuna/ Bay Of Fires Community Weekend

Having pulled out sea spurge on the beaches all through the morning rain, fifty beach walkers convened for afternoon tea and some 'snappy talks' at Eddystone Point lighthouse and afternoon sunshine for the larapuna/Bay of Fires Community Weekend on Saturday 5th August.

Over the Friday to Sunday event 130 participants walked 50km to remove thousands and thousands of sea spurge plants from this very special coastline. They also removed 40kg of marine debris, cataloguing it to add to the Tangaroa Blue marine waste database. At the lighthouse keepers' houses on Saturday, Danny Gardner led participants in a traditional Aboriginal smoking and cleansing ceremony to connect them to the land.

The annual larapuna/Bay of Fires Community Weekend focuses on the area's natural and cultural heritage and community. This year participants came from Ansons Bay to Denmark to walk the beaches together, learn about the land and its past, and care for it by collecting rubbish and pulling sea spurge: binding nature, culture and community together. The event is organised by the Parks and Wildlife Service, Break O'Day Council and Tasmanian Walking Company (who operates the Bay of Fire Lodge Walk), with support from NRM North, Aboriginal Land Council of Tasmania, Friends of Eddystone Point and Birdlife Tasmania.
