Social media training - Exploring Facebook and Twitter

Facebook (Part 1.) is for beginners and covers: What is the Facebook phenomenon, what can Facebook do for me, protecting privacy, and setting up an account.

Facebook (Part 2.) Privacy settings and controls; lists, apps, games, third party websites, ads. Using Facebook, timeline, photos, posts, events, tagging

Twitter: Why Twitter, who to follow, exploring on Twitter, lists, trends, how to tweet.

Apps for iPad and smartphones

Apps (Part 1.) What are apps, iPad basics and features, IOS 5, exploring built in everyday apps, managing apps and notifications

Apps (Part 2.) Using the iPad, Safari browsing, bookmarks and shortcuts, App Store, downloading apps

Online Safety and Security

Browser security and inbuilt features, Keeping your information safe on the Internet; your email and computer, safe passwords, scams.

Cloud storage and online photo editing

This will be broken up into 2 parts depending upon the needs of participants and topics can include; What is cloud computing, Google Drive; online document and file storage and editing, online photo storage and editing, Skydrive, Dropbox, iCloud, syncing, mobile cloud. Dropbox is the most popular session attended to date.

Internet Searching

Understanding and exploring IE9, using tools to surf the web effectively and increase your online awareness what to look for when visiting web sites and web pages, using a search engine, bookmarking, search techniques, downloading and uploading on the web.

Windows Movie Maker

Learn how to make movies, and short clips of your pictures. How to have special effects, add narration, music, and text, how to upload your movies to YouTube.

Shopping Online-eBay and Gumtree

How cyber-mall sites work. The types of activities; everything from buying selling, job searching, auctions and also protecting security, setting up account, Payment gateways such as PayPal.

Skype

How to make voice and video calls for free over the Internet, setting up an account, privacy and notifications, adding contacts, instant messaging, using Skype on mobile devices, Skype credit.

Email basics and attachments

Understanding how email works, where you get email service from, how to compose, send and respond to emails, attaching files and photos, accessing from mobile devices, communicating properly and safely online.
