Running Pink – Running for a Cure

Tasmanian Australia of the Year 2011, Deborah De Williams, is a world and Australian ultra-marathon record holder, founder of the charity organization Running Pink and passionate cancer research campaigner.

Deborah founded Running Pink in 2006, after she was diagnosed with breast cancer, with the express purpose to raise funds, through Deborah's epic runs, for breast cancer research and awareness.

In May 2011 Deborah completed a massive journey running around Australia. In the attempt, Deborah raised over

\$200,000 for breast cancer research and become the first woman to run a complete, continuous lap around Australia. The run wasn't the first time Deborah had journeyed around Australia on foot, in 2004 she became the first female to walk around Australia and raised over \$150,000 for Kids Help Line.

Today Deborah continues to campaign for cancer as she travels around Australia telling her personal story which give hope and inspiration to thousands of cancer patients, survivors & those effected by the disease.



Most people are aware of Tasmania's controversial logging history, but how many have heard about the island's fascinating mining heritage?

The Tin Dragon Interpretation Centre and Café at Derby.

My husband and I often visit family in Launceston and spend ample time at their black near. Thinking this year we could take the time to stop and explore the beautiful countryside in between due to Tasmania's North East. So we decided to drop our daughter at her grandparents' house in Launceston and take off on our own for a few days, passing at various points of interest instead of driving straight through to our final destination just north of St Helens. The Tanna Valley wine zone was an obvious attraction we had seen on the road, but where would we stop and what could we do along the way?

My husband suggested we attend the Trail of the Tin Dragon which I'd never heard of and my guess is you haven't either. Most people are aware of Tasmania's controversial logging history, but how

many have heard about the island's fascinating mining heritage? We know all about the European people in Tasmania, but what do we know about the Chinese immigrant? My husband and I were somewhat intrigued and since we were already spending the same week, decided to include some of the highlights of this trail on our itinerary.

The Trail of the Tin Dragon begins far south if you are travelling from St Helens with the last remaining Chinese temple of Guan Shi, which was gifted to the Queen Victoria Museum and Art Gallery in Launceston for safe-keeping in 1916. This event marked the end of a significant chapter in a Tasmanian mining story that my husband and I was about to begin following.

For us, one of the highlights was located in the small rural town of Hamilton where we stayed two nights at the Tin Dragon Trail Cottages on the banks of the rushing Ringensma River.



Each of the four cottages is named after miners who previously worked in the region's tin mines. The perfect place to relax and open the bottle of sparkling wine we picked up at Jervis on our way through the Tanna Valley!

From there we set out on Henry. As they walk the next morning, which had been devoted to follow the evident remnants of the Central Archa water race to the original site of an ancient mine partially obscured by the thickness of the bush. Interesting as along the way were artistic representations of tin mines in the form of stone-scape sculptures which we identified pecking

out of the forest on either side of the trail. A longer 6.5 kilometre walk can also be undertaken which continues along the Ringensma River, passes through the historic Froh mining leases, and then tracks uphill along the Gasking Star Creek near where a collapsed dam can be viewed on the Brisco water race track. This we did not attempt and instead opted to journey onwards to nearby Derby, our next stop on the Trail of the Tin Dragon.

Black and red tin mines it, but the tiny town of Derby once contained the richest tin mine in the world and the largest in the North East of

Membership fees

Family	\$200 (4 people, adults or kids) Additional people @ \$35 each
Adult	\$75
Nippers	\$50 (Under 15)
Associate	\$35 (Does not include insurance)
Try and See	\$16.50 (Includes Insurance). Then Pay \$33.50 balance next time

For those who would like to try and see we offer a one off fee of \$16.50 (Includes Insurance) and should you wish to continue a final fee of \$33.50 to become a full member.

Adult Membership

Adult Membership benefits include use of the club equipment, joining the club training for Bronze Medallion, Life Saver Patrols, Surf Boat Training and more. Excellent value and the club is only going to get bigger and bigger!!!! Membership includes insurance via Surf Life Saving Tasmania, and you must be a member to participate in events against other clubs, and to train.

Nipper Membership

While the first session is free, after this all Nippers must become members after the first session. A responsible adult (usually a parent or guardian) must attend Nipper Training and stay on the beach at all times to help supervise their child. This is not a drop & run session! Ideally the adult supervisor will assist on the beach, helping to organise events or in some other way. Membership covers the Nipper for Insurance and allows them to participate in Club Events. The responsible adult must also be a member of the club.

Associate Membership

Associate Membership is open to people wishing to access the club's social activities OR as a Responsible

-Person for one or more Nipper/s. Associate Membership provides only partial rights and privileges of the Full Club Membership's (Full Memberships are Adult, Nipper and Family Memberships). Associate Membership does not include Surf Life Saving Australia insurance (via SLST) and members cannot compete for the club or join Patrols or access Club Training or equipment for themselves.

Family Membership

As there are many different family configurations the club has aimed to accommodate as many as possible at a reduced rate, as described above. A family can therefore be configured as:

1 Adult and 3 Children

2 Adults and 2 Children

3 Adults and 1 Child

4 Adults (for example if the family has only teenaged members)

* **Additional members of the family** can be added for \$35 per person, which is slightly above breakeven for the club.

Clubhouse Sponsors

Clubhouse Sponsors are invited to buy a brick and help fund our clubhouse. Bricks will be \$25 each (one name) or \$50 for a two name or family name brick. These funds will be used predominantly to help develop the clubhouse and the equipment the club requires.
