

As many of the committee are now enjoying the freedom of getting away and have joined the 'grey nomad' set it was decided to change the dates of the AGM to reflect a time when the majority of Innovations members would be available to attend.

The traditional September/October time frame of the AGM was moved from the end of a financial year to a calendar year with the AGM held in February of this year.

Thirty people attended the 2013 meeting with the Dorset Council General Manager Mr. Tim Watson as Guest Speaker.

New members signed up to support the positive and valued work of the organization with a membership in in excess of seventy.

Outgoing President's address by Malcolm Reid at the AGM included: "I would also like to thank the scores of other volunteers who have assisted Innovations to continue to undertake our many on going activities. This include all those who record the weather statistics, work in the Pavilion welcoming visitors and locals alike, participate in the walking track working bees, assisted with our events such as the Bridport 10 and Bridport Splash, or work tirelessly on promotion tools such as developing our new website"

#### **Walking Track Maintenance**

As part of our agreement with Council we are committed to maintaining the track for five years. Although we have had some assistance from Conservation Volunteers Australia, almost all of the work has been done by volunteers on regular working bees. I wish to thank again all of those who have helped in some way.

In this context I would like to thanks Rob Perkins who has given many hours to mowing and clearing weeds around the areas that are being restored, mainly between the bridge entrance and Ada Street. Others who have contributed outside of the working bees include Phil hall and Ben Overwetter We have also received valuable funding support from NRM North for blackberry clearing and replanting. Dorset NRM and Jay Wilson in particular have been of great help with insurance and general advice.

This funding has enabled us to employ a local contactor to help with this work as required.

This year we have finally been able to install the information signage covering aboriginal heritage, flora and fauna as well as industrial history. These are state of the art and have direct digital links to our new website. Thanks must go the Judy Barnett for facilitating this process. We have also been successful in obtaining \$10,000 from the Tas Community Fund to replace the history signs along the foreshore. Hopefully this project will be completed by Mid June. Thanks go to Secretary Jen Whenn for the successful grant and Dee hardy Wilson, Ruth Cuff and Jeff Jennings for assisting with editing the text for the new signs.

#### **Events**

<u>Tidy Towns</u> – Speaking of litter and environment we entered this year for the first time for over a decade. We were runners up in the small town category and received wide ranging commendations from the judging panel. The title is a misnomer in that the award focuses on strategic environmental and social sustainability of communities rather than traditional "tidiness". Our success again points to the importance of maintaining our environmental qualities as a key factor in for future economic and social prosperity.
