

Dorset Council has now opened the new 2.8km Western Access Road into Bridport.

The road provides a second access into the township and works to reduce heavy vehicle traffic from the towns Main Streets.

Currently the road is gravel. The aim is for traffic passing on it over winter and this will help roll the road for it to be finally sealed in October this year.

The speed limit on this road is 60 km/h but will change to 80 km/h in October once sealed.


