You may know this story...... since the 50 hectare Wildflower Reserve was officially declared a Reserve in 2002, there has been a group of community members who, every time they go for a walk in the Reserve, look out for Boneseed and pull it out. In this way, the community has rid the reserve of this weed of national significance. A case of "many hands make light work". And now that lot has fallen to the next generation of walkers and carers, and this latest infestation has caught them by surprise.

Boneseed is an invasive weed species, a **declared weed which property managers are required by law to control.** It is very likely, the plants in the Reserve have come from seeds of plants growing in gardens. In fact, it's in flower right now and has been seen in a number of gardens in the Village. It looks pleasant enough with its bright yellow daisy-like flower.


Some quite large plants on the foreshore and in the wildflower reserve have recently been removed by the Parks and Wildlife team.

We are lucky to have areas of intact natural landscape on our doorstep. So, perhaps it's time to do our bit to keep the Boneseed at bay again. We could keep a look out for it as we walk the tracks; young plants are easily pulled by hand; the roots need to be pulled as well; put the plant in a bag and then in the rubbish. If you see a bush that's too big to pull by hand, please call me on 0417 149 244.

If you have it growing in your garden, it's time to replace it with something else.

Bridport Aerodrome History

The selection of Bridport for an Aerodrome had its origins as early as 1930, as motivation grew in Tasmania for commercial aerial services across Bass Strait. As a result, a survey was undertaken to establish an air route from Melbourne to Hobart, via Launceston for air mail, passenger and freight services. The route would take in Wilson's Promontory, Flinders Island, Bridport, Western Junction, Antill Ponds and Hobart. Fuel and oil depots would be established at Wilson's Promontory and Bridport to ensure the aircraft did not run short of fuel as a result of bad weather.

During April 1930, Mr McCombe, Commonwealth Inspector of Aerodromes, conducted an inspection of Bridport for the siting of an aerodrome. Upon approval from the Civil Aviation Department, an aerodrome was constructed and licensed by the end of 1930. By 1933, aircraft technology downgraded Bridport to an emergency airfield, and flights from Melbourne to Launceston simply overflew Bridport.

In the Summer of 1933, the fledgling Aero Club of Tasmania operated cross country flights from Western Junction to Bridport, delighting pleasure seekers enjoying the seaside. The route went via Lilydale and Pipers Brook, to Bridport, where people were offered local joy flights.

After very little activity during WW2, the Bridport Aerodrome regained momentum in 1947, when the Scottsdale Municipal Committee expressed interest in a modern airport at Bridport during a Ministerial visit from Canberra. The greatest interest was for commercial freight services to carry perishable commodities, such as fruit and fish. In 1950, an area 5,000 by 500 feet was allocated for the construction of an airfield suitable for heavy freight services. The North Eastern Aerodrome Co was established by Mr Merv McLennan, who proposed the company sell 25,000 shares at one pound each to fund the drome.

The aerodrome attracted visits by Trans Australian Airlines and Australian National Airways in late 1950 to assess its viability to take DC-3 and Bristol Freighter aircraft. By February 1953, the Bridport Aerodrome was finally finished, and a festive opening day was held, attracting about 3,000 people. A notable event, with the delivery of a tractor to Mr Bert Farquhar.

The Bridport Airport remains open today, with Flinders Island Aviation offering services to Bass Strait Islands.



A Raptor's Feast by Mike Douglas

One morning, a few weeks ago, I looked out of the kitchen window and was startled to see a raptor (bird of prey) devouring a blackbird on the front lawn.

Most likely it was a brown goshawk, a widespread medium-sized raptor. Less likely was a sparrow hawk, a related bird of similar appearance but somewhat smaller than a goshawk.

A strikingly imposing bird marked with brown and white bars on its underparts, yellow eyes and long yellow leges, it had the imperious and fierce demeanour displayed by many raptors.

The brown goshawk is a stealth hunter, ambushing its prey, mostly birds and rodents, from the cover of trees and shrubbery.

After the feast only a few feather remained - even the beak and feet were gobbled up.

A close relative, the grey goshawk, which in Tasmania is actually white, frequents damp forests. I've seen it in the Pearly Brook area to the southeast of Bridport. It is classified as an endangered species.




