Feedback tells us that you, our readers, also appreciate having a source of local news and information and we thank you for your support.



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Bridport Surf Life Saving Club

We are gearing up for another exciting year, with the season just around the corner. The season officially starts on the 1st of December with fantastic community-focused surf lifesaving programs including Nippers, Silver Salties, Starfish Nippers and Surf Lifesaving.

The Bridport Nippers Program has a strong emphasis on both fun and learning. Nippers offers a mix of surf safety skills, fitness activities, and plenty of fun in the sun. It's a fantastic way for children to get involved in surf lifesaving, meet new friends, and build confidence both in and out of the surf. The Nippers program is open to children aged 5 to 13, and is about teaching kids how to be safe around the surf. The club offers a 'come and try' session to anyone interested in joining Nippers.

Starfish Nippers is also offered by the club. The program is for children and young adults living with a disability or impairment that makes participation in Nippers challenging. The club offers three sessions throughout Summer. We also have two beach wheelchairs available to the public to ensure all abilities can access our beautiful beaches.

This season the club will patrol Goftons Beach on the weekends throughout December, January and February and every day between Christmas and New Year. Our surf life savers undertake training that teaches essential surf lifesaving skills, including water safety, rescue techniques, and first aid, to prepare our members to respond effectively in emergency situations at the beach. It's a great set of skills for life and we encourage people to get involved.

One of the highlights of the year for the club is the **Woolnorth Renewables Bridport Surf Sports Carnival.** The carnival is the first in the statewide series and will see over 400 competitors from across the State show off their skills and compete in a friendly yet competitive environment. The Carnival will be held over the weekend of the 7th and 8th of December at Goftons Beach and will include beach and water racing.

Three young members of our Club – Annie Howard, Cooper Reeve and Tim Innes – have been working hard over the offseason and are in contention for the honour of representing BSLSC and Tasmania at a National Level.

The Silver Salties Program is another fantastic initiative offered by the Bridport Surf Life Saving Club. This initiative is designed for

older members of the community who still want to stay active and be involved in surf lifesaving. With an emphasis on gentle fitness, social connection, and skill development, the Silver Salties Program is a wonderful program for older members of the community. This year we are encouraging everyone to bring along a body board (these can be stored at our Club Rooms) and enjoy a fun time in the water either with your body board or a paddle board. Our Season kicks off on Saturday, 30th November at 9.30 a.m. Silver Salties is a great opportunity to enjoy the beach, water and sunshine and a follow up coffee (if time permits) together in a very social fun environment - bring along your friends and support our super amazing Bridport Surf Life Saving Club!! The club is always ready to welcome new faces and continue to make a positive impact on the Bridport community. Whether you're






interested in patrolling, training, competing, or just having fun at the beach, there's a place for you at the Bridport SLSC.



- Skill development



Grass Tree Spectacular by Lou Brooker

If you camped at Waterhouse over the November long weekend, you would have noticed the mass of Grass trees in full bloom out there. Just nine months after a severe bush fire, the grass trees have responded by throwing up hundreds of flower spikes, some up to three metres tall, making a really spectacular display..

Until they put up their flower spikes in spring, you could be forgiven for ignoring them or at least not noticing them. You might have even written them off if you saw them immediately after the fire.

This is one extraordinary plant with many names. Called a 'grass tree', it has a skirt of grass-like leaves growing around a central trunk which can increase in height very slowly over time. An aboriginal name in wide use is 'yacca', a term that appears in the locality name of Yacca Creek near Ansons Bay. Another Aboriginal name, specifically used by Tasmanian first people is 'yamina'. The descriptive name 'kangaroo tails', is most apt as there is a likeness before the flowers start to form and the 'tail' is still brown.

As the flower spike reaches maturity in the spring, it begins its flowering on the northern side; the side facing the sun. After a couple of months, when all the flowers are out, the spikes are buzzing with all sorts of flies, wasps, bees, beetles and of course the honey-eating birds. At night they are probably visited by bats.

The grass trees become real pollinator magnets.

Climbing Mt. Cameron by Mike Douglas

The Mt. Cameron Range near Gladstone is popular with buswalkers. The main peak, Mt. Cameron itself, dual name Poonerluttener, is clearly visible from Bridport.

The track to the summit starts just past the gate on the orad to the Field Study Centre, an offshoot from the Old Port Road.

The four to five hour return trip traverses a good deal of rough, rocky terrain culminating in a steep scramble to the top from where there is a bird's-eye view of the far northeast and the Furneaux Islands.

Over the years many Scottsdale High School students have made the ascent as part of outdoor education activities.

A shorter walk is to the halfway mark on the track where there is

a cluster of rock pillars known as The Maze, truly an amazing


With Mt. Cameron in the background. Some flower spikes attain three metres in height

Show and Shine Car/Bike Show - Sunday 12 January 2025



Treatment of Sunburn

What is sunburn?

Sunburn is erythema and oedema from excessive exposure to the sun's rays, more specifically the ultraviolet (UV) radiation emitted from the sun. Sunburn may also occur from exposure to other UV light sources i.e. a solarium.

What is the treatment of sunburn?

The treatment of sunburn is to provide relief of the discomfort it can cause with the use of analgesics (pain-killers), cool baths, aloe vera lotions and moisturisers.

However, sunburn is better prevented than treated. Sun protection is your best defence against sunburn and other damaging effects of UV radiation.

- Avoid sun exposure, especially between 10 am to 2 pm.
- Wear protective clothing, including wide-brimmed hats.
- Apply and re-apply sunscreen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of 50+.

If you are inadvertently exposed and expect to be sunburned, you may lessen the severity of the burn with the following measures:


- Take two aspirin immediately and then two every four hours.
- Apply a topical steroid to exposed areas twice daily for two or three days.

You should see your doctor immediately for severe sunburn, or if you have: blisters that cover a large amount of your skin, have a fever or headaches, nausea or vomiting, dizziness, severe pain, swelling or if the area looks infected.

What are the long-term consequences?

It is now clear the long-term consequences of overexposure to the sun or other sources of UV radiation are significant. One blistering sunburn at least doubles the likelihood of developing skin cancer later. Sunburn may also cause premature skin ageing and wrinkles, brown spots and freckles, development of premalignant lesions and development of skin cancer (e.g., melanoma, basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma).
