Seaview Village Bridport

It's been over 40 years since the first two units at Bridport's Seaview Village were completed. Seaview Village



currently has 16 residential units with 23 residents. Seaview Village Board of Management is made up of the following volunteers:

Seaview History:

Seaview Village was created as a way of looking after the widows of the Waterhouse Soldier Settlement farmers back in the 1970s. The first committee negotiated a lease from Crown Land for 10 acres of Crown Land, and the Lands Department was contacted regarding the land located on the eastern fringe of Bridport (Albert and Thomas Streets).

An initial fund-raising target of \$10,000 was set, and donations of materials and labour were sought. The plan was to construct two units initially, primarily using volunteer labour and donated supplies.

The name 'Seaview Village' was chosen, and the committee estimated that more than 40 people in the Bridport area lived alone and required purpose-built accommodation to improve their living conditions.

By early 1980, the Association had submitted plans to Dorset Council for the first two units, with much of the work to be carried out by volunteers. Each unit would have a lounge, kitchen, bedroom, bathroom and toilet, with a storeroom between the units.

In September 1980 the Federal Government approved a grant of \$48,400 for the construction of 'four self-contained aged persons home units' at Seaview. The first two units were constructed by George Town builders Bezemer Constructions in 1981, and were officially opened by the Federal Minister for Tasmania (and Member for Bass), Kevin Newman, on June 25, 1981 at a ceremony attended by 60 guests.

We currently have a waiting list for community members who are interested in renting a unit at Seaview Village. When a vacancy occurs, the following process is followed:


- Everyone currently on the Seaview Waiting List are contacted.

made an appointment with Council workers to show them. This was an immediate success and the approach was welcomed by "the works team".





Shinning up Mt. Stronach by Mike Douglas

Looking for some summer walks? Mt. Stronach, plainly visible from Bridport and just a few minutes drive away provides some worthwhile short bushwalks.


Many locals and visitors have walked up the well-used track from Buckneys Road and admired the view from the summit, altitude 497 metres.

A rather more challenging way to the top is via the Three Mile Creek Track that goes up the southern slopes. For this bushwalk park at the junction of the Tasman Highway and Cuckoo Road. Cross the highway to the rail trail and follow it eastwards for 10 minutes to the track start.

The creek is crossed on a log followed by varied terrain, steep in places, and with surrounds quite different from those encountered on the Buckneys Road route. Both tracks end at the big summit cairn erected by surveyor Wentworth Hardy in 1885.

The Three Mile Creek Track avoids the blemishes seen on the other route caused by offroad vehicles. A free information sheet for this walk is available at the Pavilion Information Centre.




